Commitment from Parents

By accepting a place at Village Infants School you are making a commitment to our aims and agreeing to:

- Make sure your child comes to School each day (unless ill). This will help to ensure good habits are formed early.
- Arriving at School on time each day.
- Letting staff know if your child is ill and unable to come to school. Please contact the school office as soon as you are aware that your child will not be in school.
- Telling us in advance if someone else will be collecting your child by informing the class teacher or letting a member of staff know in the office.
- Keeping us informed of any changes that might impact on your child's behaviour.
- Talking to us if you have a worry or if you want to tell us about something that is going well.

Settling In

Induction arrangements are planned to ensure that all children settle well into the nursery class routines. Induction meetings are arranged before children start.

Nursery opening times

For full time children: Nursery gate opens at 8.45am until 8.55am. Pick up is from 3.20pm until 3.30pm.

For morning children: Nursery gate opens at 8.45am until 8.55am. Pick up is from 11.45am until 11.55am.

Routines

During the day your child will take part in a range of activities in both the indoor and outdoor areas, including:

- Singing and Music Making
- Story time
- Snack time, usually water, milk and fruit
- Small and Large group teaching sessions
- Time to plan their own learning and choose their own activities

Curriculum

Children learn at their best when engaged in meaningful play activities. Our Nursery curriculum is carefully planned to meet the needs of all of our children and builds upon the many and varied experiences children have had at home. Staff observe children at play to find out **what** they know and **how** they are learning, They then plan a wide range of practical and fun activities to extend their learning.

Our curriculum is planned around **3 Prime Areas** and **4 Specific Areas** and meets the requirements of the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Specific Area 4: Expressive Arts and Design

We encourage our children to express their thoughts, ideas and feelings in a variety of ways, e.g. through art, music, movement and role play.







Specific Area 3: Understanding the World

Children are naturally curious. We offer a wide range of experiences that encourage them to ask and find answers to questions about the world around them.











Prime Area 1: Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children are provided with experiences and support to help them develop a positive sense of themselves and others, to form positive relationships and develop respect for others.

Children are encouraged to develop social skills, learn how to manage their feelings, to understand appropriate behaviour in groups and to have confidence in their own abilities.



Prime Area 2: Communication and Language

Children are provided with opportunities to experience a rich language environment, to develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves, and to speak and listen in a range of activities.



Prime Area 3: Physical Development

In both the indoor and outdoor area children are encouraged to be active and to improve their skills of coordination, control and movement.



Specific Area 1: Literacy

Children are encouraged to link sounds and letters and to begin to read and write. Children are given access to a wide range of reading materials to ignite their interest.







Specific Area 2: Mathematics

Children are provided with opportunities to develop and improve their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems. Also, to describe shapes, spaces and measures.
